Christmas comes early to the needy in Pacoima *Local charity begins its 40th annual Christmas basket distribution*

- WHAT:** MEND – Meet Each Need with Dignity, the San Fernando Valley’s largest poverty-relief agency, begins its annual Christmas Basket Distribution. Families line up around the building, parents choose toys for their kids from the MEND “Toy Land,” and volunteers rush to pack and hand out baskets loaded with Christmas items.

- WHERE:** The MEND Center, 10641 N. San Fernando Rd, Pacoima
- WHEN:** Thursday, December 15 – Sunday, December 18, 2011. 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- WHO:** MEND identifies 1,400 of the area’s neediest families to receive Christmas Baskets which include enough food for Christmas dinner plus staple items, a new blanket and a new gift/toy for each child under the age of 14. Each of these families was visited in their home to determine their need and thus the size of their basket.
- WHY:** To enhance Christmas and the holiday season for families who would otherwise do without.
